Value: \$500.00 each - 1 Student and 1 Mature Student

The Native Council of PEI provides representation to all Status, non-Status, Inuit, and Métis peoples living off-reserve across ancestral Mi'kmaq territory on Epekwitk (PEI). This scholarship was created by a resolution passed on October 25, 2015, with the intent of addressing the need for Indigenous students living off-reserve to access affordable postsecondary education. This award is available thanks to the generous contributions of L'nu Fisheries Limited.

To qualify for the **student award**, applicants must be:

- Full-time student at a recognized post-secondary/industry recognized training
- Member of the Native Council of Prince Edward Island
- Less than 29 years of age at the start of the school year
- ➤ In financial need of a scholarship

To qualify for the **mature student award**, applicants must be:

- Full-time student at a recognized post-secondary/industry recognized training
- ➤ Member of the Native Council of Prince Edward Island
- > Over the age of 29 at start of the school year
- In financial need of a scholarship

Applicants who qualify can apply by submitting the completed attached form and a one-page (maximum 500 words) introduction letter. The letter may include topics such as the impact that identifying as an Indigenous person has had on your life, the importance of your culture, your future academic and career plans, and how this scholarship will help you to succeed.

Recipients selected for the award will be notified prior to October 31, 2023.
