Job Description

POSITION SUMMARY:

The Language and Drumming Program will work toward continued revitalization of language among the off-reserve Indigenous population of PEI. It will continue to build on the previous L&D programs, expanding the language resources available, incorporating more complex words and phrases to move into conversations, and adding other cultural elements to enhance the language skills developed.

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work with Mi'kmaq language instructors to prepare weekly lesson plans, including activity/language worksheets for participants.
- Invite speakers of other Indigenous languages to share words and phrases in their language with the class.
- Include activities featuring traditional activities.
- Record Word of the Week video and, with permission, other activities.
- Update/develop resources to be used in language classes.
- Invite Elders and Knowledge Keepers to provide traditional activities/teachings.
- Reach out to youth members to participate.
- Organize and deliver a 2-day language and culture retreat to include land-based traditional teachings, crafts, music, dance, and other cultural activities.
- Create and update a toolkit for each Zone.
- Update existing Language Resource Manual with new content based on class activities.
- Complete monthly and quarterly reports.
- Ensure all expenses for the month are reconciled and program budget is followed.
- Provide a summary of all program activities.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 2 years post-secondary education in related field or equivalent education/experience.
